



What do (Established) Researchers Want?

- Their entire focus is on their current research
- Administration, institutional/funder compliance, reporting and responsibility are a (resented) burden
- When the next project starts, the previous one is history (as are post-project obligations)
- The most important gift for a researcher is time
- Opportunities are there for us to save their time;
 remove burdens; smooth their work
- They will welcome the right help at the right time;
 it's up to us to sell it

Enabling Effective Support

- Support services often operate in silos, within wellworn grooves
- The skills and roles we must have are crossboundary and interdisciplinary
- Rigid administrative boundaries stifle development and change: we must understand, collaborate
- One-stop shop and smart referral: team approach
- The common goal should be a coherent Institutional Research Support Infrastructure


- Research Support: statement of intent
